- Failed, with intent, to execute the Supreme Court's Decision in Worchester v. Georgia which led to the Trail of Tears (Chief Executive)
- Succeeded in representing the common man in his fight against the national bank and defeating the re-charter with his veto power (Chief Legislator)
- Failed in numerous attempts to get the Electoral College abolished, which was a key legislative goal of his (Chief Legislator)
